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**Upcoming Mission: Post-Earthquake Follow Up Rehabilitation Mission in Haiti
Healing, Peace Building, Disaster Rehabilitation, Empowering, and Practicing Forgiveness**

We are a team of conscientious integrative healers who are trained in the 7-Step Humanitarian Integrative Healing Model at ATOP Meaningfulworld; an international humanitarian organization affiliated with the United Nations. We have decided to share our expertise and tools for healing, and learn from the indigenous healing. We have worked in Haiti for 3 years. Haiti still is struggling to recover from the devastating earthquake of January 2010 -- 230,000 people lost their lives in this devastating earthquake, 2.3 million people missing; over half of the Haitian population found themselves without homes, 70% of people's homes were destroyed. Many NGO's are leaving and the Haitians are struggling to take control of their own recovery. We feel we can help.

We are returning this year to Haiti, to continue the healing circles, the peace building workshops, empowering lectures, and training programs conducted in the past several years reaching out to many. We work with the youth giving them communication tools, hope and guidance, we work with orphans to empower them and help them create inner peace, we work with community members and local mental health professionals to provide training and support in their work to aid their communities in psychological/emotional healing, growth, forgiveness, and restoration of hope.

The 2013 Haiti ATOP Team will focus on several different aspects of outreach and service in Haiti. First, we will participate in a conference at the Universite de Notre Dame on Spirituality and Mental Health. Dr. Kalayjian is invited to give a key note address on Forgiveness and Self-Healing. In addition to presenting at the annual conference, Dr. Kalayjian and Meaningfulworld team: Shayla Tumbling, Lisa Schiller, Richard Griff, and Mileka Ackie will provide training programs with staff members of a local trauma center in Haiti: URAMEL, Unite de Rescherche et d'Action Medeco Legale,(PSYCH TRAUMA CENTER) where Roseline Benjamin serves as the Director. The URAMEL mission is to promote legal medicine and health law with legal and medical actors in particular, as well as the general public; through advocacy, training, production and research, lobbying and advocacy, and care delivery. The ATOP team will also conduct a two day training sponsored by the Mind-Body-Center with the Center's Director Linda Metayer, staff, and other community members. The training will be provided for 45 people from the Ministry of Health, physicians, psychologists and health care workers.

The ATOP Meaningfulworld 2013 Haiti Team will be able to train the staff on two levels, each training is for a full day: One level of training focuses on disaster mitigation, preparedness, and rehabilitation, and the second level will focus on conflict transformation, peace building, and forgiveness, we will also integrate leadership skills as needed. The 7-step Integrative Healing Model is central to all of our training. We have used this model for the workshops we conducted last several missions and participants were enthusiastic in their response.

In addition to the professional trainings, our team will conduct several workshops: with students of psychology and social work, with the community members at the Universite de Notre Dame's new Wellness Center, as well as working at the orphanage where we worked last year.
